



COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

Council Member Burns introduced the following resolution and moved for its adoption:

**CITY OF WELLS
RESOLUTION NO. 2010-24**

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING ASSESSMENT

WHEREAS, pursuant to proper notice duly given as required by law, the council has met and heard and passed upon all objections to the proposed assessment for the improvement of the following projects:

Bituminous Overlay

Fourth Avenue SE from Fifth Street SE to Tenth Street SE
Second Avenue SE from Third Street SE to Fourth Street SE
Second Avenue SE from First Street SE to Second Street SE
Third Avenue SW from First Street SW to Franklin Street
Third Avenue NW from First Street NW to Second Street NW
Fourth Avenue SW from First Street SW to Franklin Street
Fourth Avenue SW from Third Street SW to Fifth Street SW

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WELLS, MINNESOTA:

1. Such proposed assessment, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, is hereby accepted and shall constitute the special assessment against the lands named therein, and each tract of land therein included is hereby found to be benefited by the proposed improvement in the amount of the assessment levied against it.
2. Such assessment shall be payable in equal annual installments extending over a period of eight (8) years for the Bituminous Overlay. The first installments shall be payable on the property tax statement due May of 2011, and shall bear interest at the rate of 5 percent per annum from the date of the adoption of this assessment resolution. To the first installment shall be added interest on the entire assessment from the date of this resolution until December 31, 2011. To each subsequent installment when due shall be added interest for one year on all unpaid installments.

3. The owner of any property so assessed may, at any time prior to certification of the assessment to the county auditor, pay the entire assessment on such property, to the city treasurer. No interest shall be charged if the entire assessment is paid by November 20th of this year. You may at any time after the first of the year, pay to the city treasurer the entire amount of the assessment remaining unpaid, with interest accrued to December 31 of the year in which such payment is made. Such payment must be made before November 15 of that year. The right to partially prepay the assessment is available.
4. The clerk shall forthwith transmit a certified duplicate of this assessment to the county auditor to be extended on the property tax lists of the county. Such assessments shall be collected and paid over in the same manner as other municipal taxes.

The motion for the adoption of the foregoing resolution was duly seconded by Council Member Seedorf and upon vote being taken thereon, the following voted in favor:

Whereupon said resolution was declared duly passed and adopted by the City Council of the City of Wells, on October 12, 2010.
